Re: Offer in Compromise

Dear Richard,

My IRS troubles began in 1995 when I received a letter from the IRS asking if I would please pay them the \$239,000.00 they had determined I owed them. My accountants at the time argued somewhat successfully that I in fact really only owed around \$50,000.00 and in 1998, filed my first Offer in Compromise. Nothing seemed to come of the first offer and a new offer was filed in 1999 and then again in 2000. Still nothing seemed to happen. The IRS sent me threatening letters, filed liens and generally made life difficult but nothing happened with the offers. In 2001 the accountant handling my offers passed away and I transferred my situation to a new accountant who knew exactly what the previous accountant had done wrong and filed a new offer in 2001. Nothing continued to happen.

In 2002 I moved to Jacksonville Florida. My IRS problems of course, moved with me and new IRS liens were promptly filed. After almost eight years I was getting weary of the constant collection efforts and the lack of progress on the Offers. I had heard of Richard Camp's efforts in this area and decided to transfer my IRS problem to him. In a surprisingly short time, Richard filed new offers with the IRS and was actually taking to them! Richard seemed to produce results where all my other efforts had failed. Due to Richard's negotiating skills the IRS accepted offers totaling around \$5,700.00 to satisfy their \$50,000.00 claim in 2005. After over 10 years, I was finally free of my debt to the IRS. Thank you Mr. Camp!
